Notes

This list of deaths and of memorials is compiled in order of date of death.

It has been compiled from the following sources:

- The list of military burials in Hong Kong collected by the year 1997 by the staff of Headquarters British Forces Hong Kong. This was donated to the Branch in July 2021 by Mr Stephen Verralls, President of the Hong Kong Branch of the Orders and Medals Research Society. It had originally been given to him by Mr Colin Aitchison, RA, late photographer of Joint Services Public Relations Staff, Hong Kong, who rescued it from being destroyed when the Garrison left. This list appears in places to be based upon independent research, in other places to be based upon a reading of gravestones in the Happy Valley cemetery. It is in some cases preferable to other sources, in others it is mistaken, and there are many typographical errors. It must be used with caution.
- The Commonwealth War Graves Commission lists of Commonwealth War Graves and Memorials in Hong Kong, provided by the Senior Head Gardener, Hong Kong, Mr. Morris Cheung.

This text contains many items that are doubtful (these are marked with a ?) or have been misrepresented or are wrong (these are shown

in square brackets). Alternatives are shown with a / . Many of the gravestones and tombs now have inscriptions which can no longer be read. Others have been restored incorrectly. Where sources differ, it is not possible at this stage, without further research in military records, to clarify which source is correct.

References to the location of graves in the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley, mean: Section/row/tomb number

<u> 1902</u>

Arthur Jacobs - RN, HMS *Rosario* died ? [between 1901 and 1905], no remains or monument.

HMS *Rosario* was a Condor-class sloop launched in 1898 and moving in 1900 for service on the China Station under Commander Claude A. W. Hamilton to replace HMS *Ratler*. She converted to a depot ship in 1910. She served with submarines based in Hong Kong during the 1st World War, and was sold there for breaking up on 11 November 1921.

David Jenkin Davies - Ordinary Seaman [DRD], RN, HMS *Argonaut*, died aged 18, **1 January 1902**, commemorated on the monument to the crew of the *Argonaut* who died 1900-1902 at Section 4/18/5, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. James Black - Stoker, RN, HMS *Alacrity*, killed accidentally aged 27, **15 February 1902**, buried in Section 2/10/15, the Colonial

HMS *Alacrity* was a Surprise-class third class cruiser, launched in 1885. She was used as a dispatch vessel in HK. She was sold in 1913.

William Blair - Able Seaman, RN, HMS *Rambler*, died at HK aged 24, **13 March 1902**, buried in in Section 2/11/13, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. His gravestone, erected by the ship's company, is at:

HMS *Rambler* was an Algerine-class gun vessel of the Royal Navy, built by John Elder & Co., Glasgow and launched on 26 January 1880. She was commissioned as a survey vessel in 1884 and served in Chinese waters during the 1880s and 1890s. She provided men to a naval brigade during the Boer War. In May 1902, she was back at the China station, Captain Morris Henry Smyth in command, and in November that year she is reported leaving Nagasaki for Amoy. She was sold on 23 January 1907. Thomas Brown - Gunner, 64th Company, Royal Garrison Artillery, died at HK aged 23 / 25, **29 March 1902**, buried in Section 3/7/13, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. In 1901, the HK Garrison included B Battalion, Royal Horse Artillery; 12th Battalion, Royal Field Artillery; No 25 Company, E Division, Royal Garrison Artillery; Nos 2, 25 and 28 Companies, Southern Division, Royal Garrison Artillery; 4 companies, Hong Kong & Singapore Battalion, RA. In 1904, RA detachments were serving in the North China Army; in the South China Army were 78, 80, 83 and 89 Companies, Royal Garrison Artillery; 4 companies Hong Kong & Singapore Battalion, RA.

In 1907, the South China (HK) Garrison included 83, 87 and 88 Companies, Royal Garrison Artillery; 1,3,4 and 5 Companies HK and Singapore Battalion, Royal Garrison Artillery.

Robert Adey - Able Seaman, RN, HMS *Vestal*, drowned in HK Harbour, **11 April 1902**, buried in in Section 2/11/11, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. Frederick Oliver - Able Seaman, RN, HMS *Blenheim*, born 1 May 1882, died aged 20, **13 April 1902**, buried in Section 2/10/13, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. His gravestone, erected by his shipmates, is at:

HMS *Blenheim* was a Blake-class first class protected cruiser that was launched in 1890. Sitting Canadian Prime Minister Sir John Thompson died in England in December 1894 and was repatriated to Halifax, Nova Scotia by *Blenheim*, which was painted black for the occasion. Prince Henry of Battenberg died from malaria while on active duty on board HMS *Blonde* off Sierra Leone in January 1896. Blenheim repatriated his body from the Canary Islands. Queen Victoria appointed the commanding officer Captain Edmund S. Poe to the fourth class of the Royal Victorian Order as a mark of appreciation for this service. She was commissioned at Chatham by Captain Frank Hannam Henderson on 2 January 1901 with a complement of 593 men to serve at the China station to support the British position during the Boxer Rebellion. In June 1902 she visited Nagasaki. She served as a cruiser with the Channel Squadron until May 1908 when she joined the Mediterranean Fleet as a destroyer depot ship. She was sent to Mudros in March 1915 in support of the Mediterranean Expeditionary Force at the Battle of Gallipoli. Later that year, *Blenheim* repatriated former Canadian Prime Minister Sir Charles Tupper who had died in England in 1915 to Halifax. She was scrapped in 1926.

Walter Grounds - Petty Officer 1st Class, RN, HMS *Terrible*, born 18 June 1877, died aged 25, **2 June 1902**, buried in Section 2/11/12, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. His gravestone, erected by the ship's Officers and crew, is at:

HMS *Terrible* was the second and last of the Powerful-class protected cruisers built in the 1890s. She served on the China Station and

provided landing parties and guns which participated in the Siege and Relief of Ladysmith in the Second Boer War in South Africa. On 8 May 1900, she arrived at Hong Kong. Orders arrived on 15 June that Terrible was to load three companies of 2nd Battalion the Royal Welsh Fusiliers and sail to Taku where she arrived on the 21st. Terrible arrived in Hong Kong on 17 December after a typhoon had struck the city, and Scott volunteered to salvage the capsized dredger Canton River. In early 1901, Terrible spent several months at Hong Kong, providing relief and condensed water for the dockyard, amid an outbreak of cholera in the city leading to a water famine. A few months later she did much the same thing to help suppress the Boxer Rebellion in China. During this time, her Captain was Percy Scott who trained his crew to a high standard in gunnery and had his training methods adopted by the entire Royal Navy. Upon Terrible's return home in 1902, she was refitted for two years and was then placed in reserve, sporadically being activated to ferry replacements to China, escort a royal tour to India or participate in fleet manoeuvres. The ship served as an accommodation ship from 1909 to 1913. She subsequently made one voyage as a troop transport in 1915 before becoming a depot ship. Terrible was assigned as a training ship in 1918 before being hulked and converted to suit the role two years later. The ship was sold for scrap in July 1932.

Francis E. Pocock - Ordinary Seaman, RN, HMS *Amphitrite*, died at Muscat and buried at sea aged 18, **25 June 1902**, commemorated with Ordinary Seamen Robert W. McBride and John E. Clarke in Section 2/8/3, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. His memorial, erected by his shipmates, is at:

HMS *Amphitrite* was a ship of the Diadem-class of protected cruisers, launched in 1898. The following month she was ordered to go to China with new crews for the despatch vessel HMS *Alacrity* and the draught steamer HMS *Snipe*. She arrived at Hong Kong on 4 January 1902. On her return to England, she was recommissioned for service on the China Station, with Captain Charles Windham appointed in command. *Amphitrite* left Portsmouth for the China station on 6 May 1902, bringing crew for the draught steamer HMS *Robin*, which was stationed at Hong Kong. She arrived in Bombay on 30 June 1902, following a cruise in the Persian Gulf, during which she had made a long stop in Muscat. The largest warship thus far to visit the gulf, she drew much interest during the cruise. She stopped in Colombo in mid-July, at Singapore in late July, and arrived at the station headquarters at Hong Kong on 1 August. She served in the First World War with her sisters. In 1914 she was part of the Ninth Cruiser Squadron, serving in the Atlantic. In June 1915 she was placed in reserve, but reactivated as a Minelayer in 1917. She was sold for breaking up on 12 April 1920. *Amphitrite* had the nickname 'am and tripe' amongst her crew

Henry Charles Brown - Staff Sergeant, RE, died at HK aged 36, 8August 1902, buried in Section 3/7/17, the Colonial Cemetery,

Happy Valley. His gravestone, erected by his comrades and friends, is at:

In 1901, the Royal Engineer units in the HK Garrison were HK Company, (Submarine Miners) RE; 25th Company (Fortress) RE. In 1902, Major A. C. Painter commanded the HK Company (Submarine Miners) RE, which were retitled in 1905 to become 40th Company (Fortress) RE, then losing the responsibility for mines and Brennan torpedoes to the RN. An officer and 20 other ranks joined the mixed column deploying to Hankow in 1911.

Albert C. Trow - Corporal, 25th Company, RE, died at HK aged 35, 20 August 1902, buried in Section 3/7/19, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. John W. Cooke - Engine Room Artificer, RN, HMS *Tamar*, Naval Yard HK, died aged 28, **1 September 1902**, buried in Section 2/11/3, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. HMS Tamar was a Royal Navy troopship built by the Samuda Brothers at Cubitt Town, London, and launched in Britain in 1863. She visited Hong Kong in 1865 and took the 99th Regiment of Foot to Cape Town. In 1874, she formed part of the Naval Brigade that helped to defeat the Ashanti in West Africa, during the Ashanti War. On 7 April 1875, she ran aground whilst departing from Kingstown, County Dublin. She was refloated and resumed her voyage. On 15 April 1875, she ran aground at Chatham, Kent. She was refloated with assistance. On 7 November 1876, on a voyage from England to Bermuda, she was driven ashore at St. Catherine's Point, Bermuda. She visited Hong Kong in 1877/78 with relief crews, returning in 1886. She finally arrived in Victoria City on 11 April 1897. She was stationed permanently in the harbour as a supply ship from 1897 to 1941, when she was scuttled during the Battle of Hong Kong during World War II, to avoid being used by the invading Japanese. She gave her name to the shore station HMS Tamar in Hong Kong (1897 to 1997).

Henry Oliver - Carpenter's Mate, RN, HMS *Imperieuse*, born 1864, died aged 38, **1 September 1902**, buried in Section 2/10/6, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. HMS *Imperieuse* was an Imperieuse-class armoured cruiser launched in 1883. She was the flagship of the China Station from 1889 to 1894 and the Pacific Station from 1896 to 1899. She returned to Chatham for refit in 1900. She was converted into a depot ship in 1905 and renamed HMS *Sapphire II*. The name reverted to *Imperieuse* in 1909 and she was sold in 1913.

Norman McLeod - Sapper, 25th Company, RE, died at HK aged 23, 12 September 1902, buried in Section 3/7/22, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. His gravestone, erected by his comrades, is at:

HMS *Sirius* was an Apollo-class cruiser of the British Royal Navy launched in 1890, which served from 1892 to 1918 in various colonial posts such as the South and West African coastlines. She served off America from 1892 to 1895 and on the China station from 1903 to 1905. On return from overseas, she went into reserve at Devonport. In February 1912, *Sirius* became part of the training squadron. In April 1918, *Sirius* was deliberately scuttled in the mouth of Ostend harbour in Belgium during the failed First Ostend Raid. This operation was intended to block the harbour mouth and prevent the transit of German U-boats and other raiding craft from Bruges to the North Sea. German countermeasures were however too effective, and *Sirius* and her fellow blockship HMS *Brilliant* were eventually destroyed by their crews outside the harbour mouth after running aground on a sandbank. The wrecks were broken up after the war

HMS *Argonaut* was a Diadem-class armoured cruiser launched in 1898. She was commissioned for service on the China station in 1900, where she was until 1904. During this time, the Commanding Officer, Captain George H. Cherry RN, issued some 600 punishment warrants, gaining a reputation as a stern disciplinarian. As a consequence, the ship's officers ordered medals to be struck by Gamages of London as reward and mementos of their service under such a captain: on the obverse it read "Argonaut China 1900-1904" and showed a foul anchor (for the Royal Navy), a fleece (for Argonaut) and a dragon (for China); on the reverse are a cherry tree and a representation of the officers who survived the commission. An honorary "Cherry Medal" was presented to King George VI. From 1906 she served in the Home Fleet, and during the First World War she served in the Atlantic. She was converted to hospital ship in 1915, and sold for breaking up in 1920 and broken up in 1921.

HMS Andromeda was a Diadem-class cruiser launched in 1897. She joined the Mediterranean Fleet, where she helped to escort a royal yacht during its cruise through the Mediterranean Sea. Captain Francis Foley was appointed in command on 12 March 1901. That month the ship was one of two cruisers tasked to escort the ocean liner HMS Ophir, commissioned as a royal yacht for the world tour of the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York (later King George and Queen Mary), from Gibraltar to Malta, and then to Port Said. Captain Christopher Cradock was appointed in command on 24 March 1902, and from 11 June that year Andromeda served as flagship to Rear-Admiral Sir Baldwin Wake Walker, commander of the Cruiser Division of the Mediterranean Fleet. In May 1902, she visited Palermo to attend festivities in connection with the opening of an Agricultural Exhibition by King Victor Emmanuel, and the following month the ship was in Gibraltar for a coronation fête. Andromeda and other ships of the division visited Argostoli in early October 1902, then was assigned to the China Station in 1904. She returned home three years later to be reduced to reserve. Andromeda was converted into a training ship in 1913. She later served as a depot and training ship, being renamed HMS Powerful II in 1913, HMS Impregnable II in 1919 and HMS Defiance in 1931. She was broken up in 1956.

Edmund Henry Jellicoe - Lieutenant Commander, RN, HMS *Whiting*, youngest son of John Henry Jellicoe, Captain, R. M. S. P Ct., born 10 September 1875, died aged 29, **30 December 1904**, buried in Section 18/7/9, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. Jellicoe was the much younger brother of Admiral of the Fleet John Rushworth Jellicoe. He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant on 30 September, 1898. Shortly after being appointed in command of the *Whiting* on the China Station, he was found in his cabin with a gunshot wound to the head. HMS *Whiting* was a Star-class destroyer launched in 1896. On 26 June 1897, she was present at the Royal Naval Review at Spithead in celebration of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee. In 1897 she was deployed to the China Station and remained there for the rest of her service life. On 17 June 1900 during the Boxer Rebellion in China, she and *Fame* were involved in operations against the Taku forts and Chinese destroyers. This resulted in the capture of four Chinese destroyers including *Hai Lung* (renamed HMS *Taku*). Lieutenant Charles Pleydell Mansel was appointed in command in July 1902, but was succeeded by Lieutenant Harry Lionel Wells already the next month, on 18 August 1902. She was granted the battle honour 'China 1900'. During the summer of 1911 she was at Nanking during the Revolution in China and from there she moved on to Kiu Kiang and Hankow. She was sold in 1919.

HMS *Albion* was a Canopus-class pre-dreadnought battleship launched in 1898, intended for service in Asia. She spent 1901-1905 on the China Station, before returning to British waters to serve with the Channel Fleet and later the Atlantic Fleet. After the outbreak of the First World War in August 1914, she was mobilised and returned to the Channel Fleet, but was quickly sent to the Atlantic to help defend against the possibility of German warships breaking out of the North Sea. In December and January 1915, she supported operations against German Southwest Africa. The ship was transferred to the Mediterranean Sea in January 1915 to participate in the Dardanelles Campaign. She participated in major attacks on the Ottoman coastal fortifications defending the Dardanelles in March 1915, and was damaged by Ottoman artillery twice. In October 1915, she was transferred to Salonika to support the Allied operations against Bulgaria through then-neutral Greece. She was transferred back to Ireland in April 1916 for service as a guard ship, a role she filled until October 1918, when she was reduced to a barracks ship. Albion was sold for scrap in December 1919

HMS *Hogue* was a Cressy-class armoured cruiser launched in 1900. Upon completion she was assigned to the Channel Fleet and in 1904 to the China Station. In 1906 she became a training ship for the North America and West Indies Station before being placed in reserve in 1908. Recommissioned at the start of World War I, she played a minor role in the Battle of Heligoland Bight a few weeks after the beginning of the war. *Hogue* was sunk by the German submarine U-9, together with two of her sister ships, on 22 September 1914.

Two companies went to Peking, two to Tientsin, the remainder stayed in Murray Barracks. It provided the guard of honour for Prince Arisugawa of Japan in HK in 1905, and moved to Singapore in 1906 on the SS *Soudan*, relieved in October by 3rd Battalion the Middlesex Regiment. In 1906 she became a training ship for the North America and West Indies Station before returning home and being assigned as the flagship of the reserve Third Fleet in 1909. Relieved as flagship in 1910, she remained in reserve until the beginning of World War I in August 1914. She was spent most of the war on convoy escort duties before becoming an accommodation ship in 1917 and then a depot ship in 1918. *Sutlej* was sold for scrap in 1921.

HMS *Vengeance* was a Canopus-class battleship launched in 1899 and sold in 1921. Intended for service in Asia, *Vengeance* and her

sister ships were smaller and faster than the preceding Majestic-class battleships, but retained the same battery of four 12-inch (305 mm) guns. She also carried thinner armour, but incorporated new Krupp steel, which was more effective than the Harvey armour used in the Majestics. On entering service, Vengeance was assigned to the China Station, but the Anglo-Japanese Alliance rendered her presence there unnecessary, and she returned to European waters in 1905. She then served in the Channel Fleet until 1908, when she moved to the Home Fleet, thereafter serving in secondary roles, including as a tender and a gunnery training ship. In 1913, she was transferred to the 6th Battle Squadron of the Second Fleet. In August 1914, Vengeance patrolled the English Channel with the 8th Battle Squadron before moving to Alexandria to protect the Suez Canal in November 1914. She then joined the Dardanelles Campaign in January 1915, where she saw extensive action trying to force the Dardanelles strait in February and March and later supporting the fighting ashore during the Gallipoli Campaign in April and May. She was recommissioned in December 1915 for service in East Africa, during which she supported the capture of Dar es Salaam in German East Africa. She returned to Britain again in 1917 and was decommissioned, thereafter serving in subsidiary roles until 1921, when she was sold for scrap.

HMS *Centurion* was a Centurion-class battleship launched in 1892. HMS Centurion was the lead ship of her class of two pre-dreadnought battleships built for the Royal Navy in the 1890s. Intended for service abroad, they exchanged heavy armour and a powerful armament for high speed and long range to counter the foreign armoured cruisers then being built as commerce raiders and were rated as second-class battleships. Launched in 1892, Centurion was assigned to the China Station in 1894 under the command of Captain Edmund Poë. On reaching Singapore, Vice-Admiral The Honourable Sir Edmund Fremantle, Commander-in-Chief of the China Station, hoisted his flag aboard her. Captain John McQuhae relieved Poë three days later. In his turn, McQuhae was relieved by Captain Spencer Login on 21 March 1895. Vice-Admiral Sir Alexander Buller relieved Fremantle on 28 May. Centurion ran aground on a sandbank at Shimonoseki, Japan in June 1896, but was not damaged. Captain John Jellicoe (the future First Sea Lord) assumed command of the ship on 12 February 1898. A week later, Vice-Admiral Sir Edward Seymour hoisted his flag aboard her. During the Boxer Rebellion, together with her sister ship, Barfleur, she contributed men to Seymour's expedition that attempted and failed to relieve the besieged International Legations in Peking, capital of China, between 10 and 28 June 1900. Jellicoe served as Seymour's flag-captain during the expedition and was badly wounded on the 21st. In addition, the ship put landing parties ashore which joined other forces in storming the Taku forts on 16–17 June and in relieving the foreign legations at Tientsin on 13-14 July. While anchored at Woosung, near Shanghai, she parted her mooring cables during a storm on 17 April 1901 and drifted across the bows of the battleship HMS *Glory*. *Glory*'s bow punched a hole in Centurion's hull below the waterline, but the damage was not serious and was repaired at Hong Kong. *Glory* relieved Centurion as flagship on 10

June and Vice-Admiral Sir Cyprian Bridge relieved Seymour on the 26th. Centurion, with Seymour aboard, arrived at Portsmouth on 19 August, where she was welcomed by the local Commander-in-Chief and thousands of people lining the beach and pier. Admiral Seymour struck his flag on 21 August, and, after a month. She was rebuilt with a more powerful secondary armament. Centurion rejoined the China Station in 1903. In 1905, the United Kingdom and Japan renewed the Anglo-Japanese Alliance which reduced the need for a large Royal Navy presence on the China Station and all its battleships were withdrawn. Accordingly, on 7 June, Centurion, together with the battleship HMS Ocean, departed Hong Kong. At Singapore, they rendezvoused with the battleships HMS Albion and HMS Vengeance. The four battleships departed Singapore on 20 June and steamed in company to Plymouth, where they arrived on 2 August. Already made obsolete by the increasing speeds of the cruisers the ship was designed to defend against, she was placed in reserve until 1909. She was sold in 1910.

HMS *Monmouth* was a Monmouth-class armoured cruiser launched in 1901. She was assigned to the 1st Cruiser Squadron of the Channel Fleet then transferred to the China Station in 1906, and remained there until she returned home in 1913. She was assigned to the reserve Third Fleet. When World War I began in August 1914, the ship was recommissioned and assigned to the 5th Cruiser Squadron in the Central Atlantic to search for German commerce raiders and protect Allied shipping. She was detached upon arrival to patrol the Brazilian coast for German ships, and was later ordered to the South Atlantic to join Rear Admiral Christopher Cradock's squadron in their search for the German East Asia Squadron. He found the German squadron on 1 November off the coast of Chile. The German squadron outnumbered Cradock's force and were individually more powerful; they sank Cradock's two armoured cruisers in the Battle of Coronel. *Monmouth* was lost with all hands.

HMS Astraea was an Astraea-class cruiser launched in 1893. She served in the Mediterranean Sea in early 1900 under the command of Captain Alfred Paget, and was in China in 1901 under the command of Captain Casper Joseph Baker. She left Hong Kong on 27 March 1902, homeward bound, arriving in Singapore on 2 April, Colombo on 10 April, Suez on 27 April, Malta on 2 May, and in Plymouth on 14 May, having convoyed the destroyer Skate from the Mediterranean. She was serving off East Africa at Zanzibar when the First World War broke out, and the squadron was initially assigned to protect British Empire shipping travelling on the trade routes around the African coast. On 8 August 1914 Astraea bombarded Dar-es-Salaam, part of the German colony of German East Africa. Astraea's guns destroyed a radio station, and fearing an imminent landing, the German authorities scuttled their floating dock to block the harbour. This had the subsequent effect of preventing the German commerce raider SMS Königsberg from being able to return to the port. Astraea was later one of the ships assigned to hunt and blockade Königsberg in the Rufiji Delta. In May 1915 Astraea became the ship of the senior naval

officer assigned to support the invasion of Kamerun. She was sold in 1920.

HMS *King Alfred* was a Drake-class armoured cruisers launched in 1901. She served as flagship of the China Station from 1906 until relieved in 1910. Upon her return home that year, she was placed in reserve before being recommissioned in mid-1914. She was assigned to the 6th Cruiser Squadron of the Grand Fleet at the beginning of World War I. She was transferred to the 9th Cruiser Squadron in 1915 and assigned to convoy protection duties by the end of the year. *King Alfred* participated in the unsuccessful searches for the German commerce raider SMS *Möwe* in 1916–17 before beginning to escort convoys later that year. The ship was torpedoed by a German submarine in 1918, but returned to service. She was sold for scrap in 1920.

The Hong Kong and Singapore Battalion RGA has its origins in the company of Madrassees formed at Fort St. George, India, and sent to Hong Kong in 1841 as China Gun Lascars; it had no British Officers. In 1865, men of all Asiatic nations were enlisted for A Company, which was commanded by a British Subaltern or Captain (then Captain Blackenbury, of 8/1 Southern Division Royal Artillery) from the Garrison, with a British corporal or bombardier for clerical duties. In 1881 another company was formed; Colonel Hall, the then Officer Commanding Royal Artillery, Hong Kong, expressing a desire that the new company should be composed entirely of Sikhs enlisted in the Punjab. In the meantime local enlistment was allowed. The new B company arrived in Hong Kong in July, 1881. In 1891 a General Order authorized the designation 'Asiatic Artillery.'

They were armed with 64 pounder R.M.L. and 7 pdr R.M.L. In 1885, a detachment was sent to Singapore to form a nucleus of a new company. In 1889 the system of detailing an officer from the British companies to temporarily command the corps was discontinued, and Captain Hawkins - specially detailed from Home - took the command, In 1890 the two companies were encamped at Kowloon Dock for the purpose of mounting the gun at Kowloon East Fort. In the same year two ten-inch Breach Loading guns were mounted at Stonecutters West Fort. In 1891, the Asiatic Artillery was increased by the formation of c and D companies. In 1893 the gun lascar companies in Asia were renamed Local Companies, Royal Artillery. In 1898, two separate battalions were formed: The Hong Kong and Singapore Battalion, Royal Artillery, headquartered in Hong Kong, and the Ceylon Battalion, Royal Artillery, headquartered in Ceylon. In 1899 the Royal Artillery was split into two and the Royal Garrison Artillery came into being. This had an effect on Indian units and in 1899 the battalion was renamed Hong Kong Singapore Battalion, Royal Garrison Artillery. In 1907, the Mauritius company of the Ceylon Battalion was absorbed into the Hong Kong Singapore Battalion RGA. This battalion then provided the manpower for Hong Kong, Singapore and Mauritius with its headquarters in Hong Kong. A company of the Corps proceeded to Taku as part of the China Expeditionary Force and served with distinction throughout the operations against the Boxers. The officers with this Company were Captain Duff and Lieutenant Badham-Thornhill.

HMS Kent was a Monmouth-class armoured cruiser launched in 1901. She was placed in reserve when completed in 1903, but was recommissioned for the China Station in 1906. She remained there until she returned home in 1913. In 1914, Kent was ordered to the South Atlantic to join Rear-Admiral Christopher Cradock's squadron in their search for the German East Asia Squadron, but arrived at the Falkland Islands after the British squadron had been destroyed in the Battle of Coronel. During the subsequent Battle of the Falkland Islands at the end of 1914, the ship sank the German light cruiser Nürnberg. Several months later she discovered the sole surviving German ship from that battle and forced the light cruiser Dresden to scuttle herself in the Battle of Más a Tierra. She was assigned to patrol the South American coast for the rest of 1915, but was transferred to the Cape Station in early 1916 to begin convoy escort duties along the West African coast until mid-1918 when she returned to the China Station. In early 1919 the ship was deployed to Vladivostok to support the Siberian Intervention against the Bolsheviks during the Russian Civil War. She did little militarily there, although she contributed

some crewmen to man gunboats supporting the Whites opposing the Bolsheviks. Kent was sold for scrap in China in 1920.

HMS *Waterwitch*, a hydrographic survey vessel, originally called *Lancashire Witch*, was purchased in 1893 and active in eastern Asian waters from 1894 to 1912. Between 1898 and 1907 she worked the coast of China, including Hong Kong, Weihaiwei and the Yangtze River. In early 1900 Commander Willoughby Pudsey Dawson was in command, succeeded by Lieutenant W. O. Lyne when she was recommissioned on 16 February 1900. She formed part of the British naval contingent involved in relieving the Peking legations during the Boxer Rebellion in 1900 and surveyed the north channel of the Yangtze prior to the battleship Centurion's navigation of the river. In 1902 Lieutenant and Commander Ernest Clifford Hardy was in command, and she was in Hong Kong in October that year.

Socotra Rock was surveyed by Waterwitch confirming a depth of less than 18 ft (5.5 m),[13] and she met severe gales in the Formosa

Channel in 1903, and lost three men overboard. In 1906 she escaped being driven ashore in Chauan Bay by weighing anchor and steaming to safety in the calm of the storm-centre as it passed over. In 1908, under Lieutenant Percy Douglas, she surveyed around Singapore and Klang, with work in this area continuing under other commanding officers until she sank in 1912 after being accidentally rammed by a launch belonging to the governor of Singapore.

The 1st Battalion the King's Own (Yorkshire Light Infantry) relieved the 2nd Battalion the Buffs in the HK Garrison on 1 December 1910, arriving on board the RIMS *Hardinge*. HQ, the Band, Buglers, and 2 companies were in Murray Barracks, 4 companies were in Mount Austin Barracks on the Peak, 2 companies were at Whitfield Barracks, Kowloon. One company under Major W. M. Withycombe was sent to garrison Hankow on 5 December 1911, on board the ship *Kwong Sang*, being fired at ineffectually by Chinese rebels on the River Yangste. They returned to HK on 20 December 1912 on board the SS *Chin Hua*. HMS Clio was a Cadmus-class sloop launched in 1903. Clio started her career on the Australia Station, where she arrived in May 1904. In July she made an Island trip and visited Nouméa, Suva, Tonga. The visit was in connection with the proposal of the Admiralty to examine the various reefs in the Cook and other groups, to make safe entrances for the surf boats, discharging and loading cargo. After visiting Mangain, Aitutaki, and other islands, the Clio proceeded to Tahiti. After blasting passages through the coral reefs at Savage Island and other islands she reached Auckland in September and stayed for two months in New Zealand waters. Planning to return to Sydney for Christmas, she visited Fiji again, where she stayed at the disposal of the Governor because of political problems at Tonga, to which she made some tours. In February she finally returned to Sydney. After a visit to Hobart Clio left Australia in April 1905 for the China Station. In 1908, the Clio transported British journalist Ernest Bethell from Chemulpo to Shanghai to serve a sentence of imprisonment for inciting Koreans to oppose Japanese rule of Korea. She was sold in 1920.

^{1st} Battalion Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers were in at Tientsin from November 1909, having sailed from Malta in HM Troopship *Soudan* almost two months earlier. Battalion Headquarters was at Tientsin with one company immediately dispatched to guard the British Legation in Peking. Chinese troops in Peking mutinied in 1911 and started to burn and plunder the capital. They wrecked the offices of the Tientsin-Peking Railway, which was being guarded by the European Powers that had undertaken to keep them open. The Inniskillings were sent to their aid and a successful parley between the Commanding Officer and the rebels led to their withdrawal with no casualties. The Inniskillings again embarked for India at Chin Wang Tao, the port of Tientsin, on 4 November 1912 and landed at Bombay on 3 December.

HMS *Minotaur* was the lead ship of the Minotaur class of armoured cruisers, launched in 1906. The ship was assigned to the 5th Cruiser Squadron of the Home Fleet upon commissioning. She escorted the royal yacht Victoria and Albert from Kiel, Germany to Reval when King Edward VII and his wife visited in Russia in June. The next month Minotaur escorted the battlecruiser *Indomitable* as it carried the Prince of Wales to Canada to commemorate the tercentenary of Quebec City. The ship was transferred to the 1st Cruiser Squadron when the Home Fleet reorganized on 24 March 1909. She was present for two fleet reviews in June and July before she was ordered to the China Station in January 1910 to relieve *King Alfred* as flagship. Minotaur was in Wei Hai Wei on 3 July 1914 when most of the ships assigned to the China Station were ordered to assemble at Hong Kong. She was broken up in 1920.

She spent her entire career in the Far East. *Cadmus* started her career on the Australia Station, where she arrived on 13 July 1904; her maiden voyage to Australia was accomplished in record time for a sloop. In May 1905, she was ordered to follow *Clio* to the China Station and served there for the rest of her career. She recommissioned at Hong Kong on 18 October 1912, and remained on the China Station during World War I. In November 1914 she arrived at Direction Island in the Indian Ocean a week after the battle between *Emden* and *Sydney* to bury the sailors killed in action. She was in Singapore during the Sepoy Mutiny of February 1915, and her crew was involved in capturing the mutineers. She was sold at Hong Kong in 1921.

The 25th Punjabis, commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel Reginald E. H. Dyer, moved to Hong Kong from Multan on board RIMS Hardinge to protect British interests following the Chinese Revolution of 1911. Stationed on their arrival on 7 February 1911 first in tents on reclaimed land in Hung Hom near the Kowloon railway terminus, then in sheds at the Standard Oil terminal in Lai Chi Kok. They conducted border patrols and mounted observation posts, and patrolled villages in the New Territories. The Battalion was given the Governor's thanks for its gallantry in putting out a fire in the oil tanks alongside their quarters in October 1913, thereby saving the Standard Oil Company facility. They moved to Happy Valley at the outbreak of the First World War in August 1914, with two companies in Victoria Barracks in Fortress Reserve. In September 1914, they were stationed in Whitfield Barracks, with two companies remaining in Fortress Reserve in Murray Barracks. The regiment returned from Hong Kong to India in ?March 1915.

Ishwar Jaganath - Sepoy, Number 408, 26th Punjabis, died 12September 1914. Cremated, listed in the Hong Kong Hindu and Sikh Cremation Memorial, Happy Valley.

26th Punjabis moved to Hong Kong from Samana in the Punjab, via Karachi, in 1911 to protect British interests following the Chinese Revolution, arriving in HK on 13 and 14 February 1911. They were stationed at Rennie's Mill (Tseung Kwan O). On 26 August 1912, they were part of an expeditionary force tp eradicate pirates in the Pearl River estuary. On the outbreak of the First World War in August 1914, the regiment moved first to Quarry Point then in September to to Whitfield Barracks, just vacated by 8th Rajput Infantry. They returned from Hong Kong to the North-West Frontier in March 1915.

HMS Psyche, a Pelorus third class protected cruiser was commissioned in the RN in 1899. She arrived in Sydney in 1913, and was serving in New Zealand waters at the outbreak of World War I in 1914. She decommissioned on 22 January 1915 and was laid up in Sydney. In July 1915, HMAS *Psyche* was commissioned into the RAN under the command of Commander (later Rear Admiral) Henry Feakes, RAN. *Psyche* and HMAS *Fantome* patrolled in the Bay of Bengal. She remained for the next two years in Asian waters. Psyche was posted at Rangoon with orders to organise a patrol scheme for the Burmese coast. In 1916, *Psyche* arrived at Hong Kong for her annual inspection and refit. During this period, six officers and more than 70 ratings were landed to the naval hospital at Hong Kong for treatment of various ailments including Dengue Fever and other similar conditions. Combined with some 40 more ratings and an officer sick on board, around half of Psyche's complement were incapacitated due to illness. Patrol duties off the south coast of China commenced on 14 August. The ship was ordered to Singapore. in October 1916. She was sold in 1922.

HMS *Suffolk* was a Monmouth-class armoured cruiser launched in 1903. Upon completion she was assigned to the 3rd Cruiser Squadron of the Mediterranean Fleet and was then assigned to the 5th Cruiser Squadron in the Mediterranean in 1909 then became the flagship of the 4th Cruiser Squadron on the North America and West Indies Station in 1913. After the beginning of World War I in August 1914, *Suffolk* searched for German commerce raiders while protecting British shipping. She captured a German merchantman shortly after the war began. She remained in the Atlantic until she became flagship of the China Station in 1917. In late 1918 the ship was deployed to Vladivostok to support the Siberian Intervention during the Russian Civil War. She returned home in 1919 and briefly became a training ship before she was sold for scrap in 1920.

On 12 December 1937, *Bee*, along with *Ladybird*, became involved in the Panay incident, coming under fire from a Japanese artillery unit near Wuhu on the Yangtze. *Ladybird* took six shells and *Bee* dodged a shell as she came upon the scene. *Bee* was paid off in 1938.

In 1919, during the Russian Civil War, *Cicala* served on the Dvina River (northern Russia, in Arkhangelsk Oblast), fighting in support of White Russian forces. The crew of Cicala mutinied, as part of a wider wave of unrest in the Royal Navy, and five "ringleaders" were sentenced to death, later commuted to five years' imprisonment. She was bombed in HK by the Japanese in 1941 and scuttled.

HMS *Ambrose* was a cargo liner that was commissioned as an armed merchant cruiser in 1914-1915, later converted into a submarine depot ship in 1917. She was stationed at Berehaven, Ireland in January 1918 and transferred to Falmouth, Cornwall in November. In 1919 she was stationed at Devonport. From 19 September 1918 until 30 October 1920 her commander was Commander Cecil Talbot. On 1 October 1919 *Ambrose* and HMS *Titania* were sent to support the Fourth Submarine Flotilla in Hong Kong, replacing HMS *Rosario*. Six L-class submarines accompanied Ambrose: HMS L1, L3, L4, L7, L9 and L15. *Ambrose* and her submarines reached Hong Kong in January 1920. She spent long periods at the Royal Navy bases in Hong Kong and Weihaiwei. She also visited Kobe and Shanghai in 1920, Nagasaki and Kobe in 1921 and Singapore in 1923. In 1928, she was laid up in the Reserve Fleet in Britain. She was renamed HMS *Cochrane* in 1938 and was broken up in 1946.

In 1908, the Royal Engineers Signal Service was formed. And included motorcycle despatch riders and wireless sets in service in the 1st World War. A Royal Warrant for the creation of a Corps of Signals was signed by the Secretary of State for War, Winston Churchill, on 28 June 1920. Six weeks later, King George V conferred the title Royal Corps of Signals. First mention of a Royal Corps of Signals Section in HK is in 1924; there was also a North China Signals Section. By 1925, when the HK Signal Section was commanded by Captain C. A. Brigland DRC, at least 12 Chinese soldiers had been recruited alongside 15 British personnel. Shanghai Defence Forces also had a Signals Section by 1927.

HMS *Hermes* was the first purpose built aircraft carrier in the world to be launched, in 1919. Finally commissioned in 1924, she served briefly with the Atlantic Fleet before spending the bulk of her career assigned to the Mediterranean Fleet and the China Station. In the Mediterranean, she worked with other carriers developing multicarrier tactics. Captain Arthur Stopford was appointed as the ship's commanding officer in February 1923 and *Hermes* was assigned to the Atlantic Fleet. She participated in the fleet review conducted by King George V on 26 July in Spithead. Afterwards she transferred to the Mediterranean Fleet. She arrived at Malta on 22 November 1923; at this time the ship embarked No. 403 Flight with Fairey Flycatcher fighters and 441 Flight with Fairey IIIDs. *Hermes* sailed for the China Station on 17 June with 403 and 441 Flights aboard. En route in the Mediterranean, Captain Stopford was replaced by Captain C. P. Talbot. She arrived at Hong Kong on 10 August 1925. The ship made her first foreign port visit to Amoy in November. She was sunk in a Japanese air attack off Battacoa in 1942.

The ship remained active throughout the war, before striking a naval mine in the Yangtze River in 1945 and sinking.

Maurice Anthony Maude - Sub Lieutenant, RN, HMS Vindictive, second and dearly beloved son of Anthony Fritz Maud, land agent, of Belgard Castle, County Dublin and his wife, accidently killed at Lan Tau aged 26, 11 December 1926, buried in Section 21A/2/10, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. Maude was educated at the Royal Naval College. In 1916, he was appointed to HMS Vivacious and saw active service in the Baltic. In 1919, he spent six months at Caius College, Cambridge, and obtained a first in all subjects. He served later in the Atlantic Fleet, and in 1924 was transferred to the Fleet Air Arm, and underwent his training at Netheravon and Leuchars. He was then appointed to HMS Vindictive and served in the aircraft carrier *Hermes* at Malta and later at Hong Kong. When HMS *Hermes* was recalled to Malta, Maurice, although only 26 years of age, was appointed to the command of a detached flight (a component part of a squadron) consisting of six seaplanes. On 11 December 1926, as reported in *Lancashire Evening Post*, Maurice 'went with two friends to Lantao for a day's game shooting, and when the party were descending a hill at dusk to embark for Hong Kong Lieutenant Maude stumbled against his gun, which went off and shot off his head.' HMS *Vindictive* was a Hawkins-class heavy cruiser launched in 1918, converted into an aircraft carrier while still being built. In 1919, she participated in the British campaign in the Baltic against the Bolsheviks during which her aircraft made numerous attacks against the naval base at Kronstadt. Vindictive returned home at the end of the year and was placed in reserve for several years before her flight decks were removed and she was reconverted back into a cruiser. The ship retained her aircraft hangar and conducted trials with an aircraft catapult before she was sent to the China Station in 1926. A year after her return in 1928, she was again placed in reserve. In 1944 and was damaged by a German torpedo off the coast of Normandy after the Allies invaded France. She was reduced to reserve after the war and sold for scrap in 1946.

HMS Danae was a Danae-class light cruiser launched in 1918. she was one of the fastest cruisers of her time; she could travel at 29 knots Attached to the Harwich-based 5th Light Cruiser Squadron, she took part in several North Sea patrols during the last months of World War I. Between October and November of the following year, she passed to the Baltic Sea, where she supported the Whites in the Russian Civil War, along with her sister ships Dragon and Dauntless. In February 1920 she was attached to the 1st Light Cruiser Squadron of the Atlantic Fleet. In 1923 she was attached to the Special Service Squadron, a naval fleet created for propaganda purposes. The flotilla further consisted of the battlecruisers Hood, Repulse and the cruisers Delhi, Dragon, Dauntless and Dunedin, as well as 9 other ships (mostly destroyers), sailing to Freetown, Sierra Leone, Cape Town, Port Elizabeth, East London and Durban, Zanzibar, Trincomalee, Singapore, Fremantle, Albany, Adelaide, Melbourne, Hobart and Sydney, from where she left for Wellington in New Zealand. She paid a short visit in 1924 to Suva and Samara, Fiji, then to Honolulu, Victoria, Vancouver and San Francisco. The light cruisers then sailed south around South America visiting various ports on the way, Callao, Valparaiso and Talcahuano and through the Strait of Magellan. From there stopping at the Falkland Islands, Bahia Blanca, Buenos Aires, Montevideo and Rio de Janeiro, crossing the Atlantic Ocean with a

final stop on the Cape Verde Islands before heading back for the Great Britain. Transferred to the Mediterranean, between 1927 and 1929 *Danae* served as an escort of the 1st Cruiser Squadron, after which she was withdrawn. She was lent to the Polish Navy between 1944 and 1946 as ORP *Conrad* and was sold for scrapping in 1948.

Edward Bamford - Major, VC, DSO, Royal Marines, born 28 May, 1887, died of pneumonia on board HMS Cumberland en route for Hong Kong, where he held the appointment of Instructor of Small Arms and Musketry, aged 41, 30 September 1928, buried in Bubbling Well Cemetery, Nanjing Road, Shanghai, moved with other graves to Hungjao Road Cemetery in 1951. Bamford joined the RMLI in 1905. He was awarded the DSO for his gallantry aboard HMS Chester at the Battle of Jutland, and the VC for his action at Zeebrugge in April 1918. He landed on the Mole from HMS Vindictive with Nos. 5, 7 & 8 platoons of the Marine Storming Force in the face of great difficulties. When on the Mole under heavy fire, he displayed the greatest initiative in the command of his company, and by his total disregard of danger, showed a magnificent example to his men. He first established a strong point on the right of the disembarkation, and when that was safe, led an assault on a battery to the left with the utmost coolness and valour.

The Royal Marine Artillery (RMA) and Royal Marine Light Infantry (RMLI) were amalgamated on 22 June 1923 to form the Royal Marines. HMS *Cumberland* was a County-class heavy cruiser launched in 1926. She served on the China Station with the 5th Cruiser Squadron from 1928 until 1938, returning to the UK in March 1935. She served throughout the 2nd World War and was scrapped in 1959.

HMS *Cornflower* was an Arabis-class sloop launched in 1916. In 1927, she relieved HMS *Hollyhock* in Hong Kong. On 31 March 1934, the Royal Navy presented the ship to the HKNVR on permanent loan as a drill ship. Hong Kong Commodore-in-Charge Frank Elliot replaced the crest and motto of the ship with that of Clan Elliott (Elliot's ancestor Charles Elliot had also been the first Administrator of Hong Kong). In April 1934, she was put under the command of Lieutenant-Commander H. S. Rouse. She remained stationery at Wan Chai where she served as the headquarters and training ship of the HKNVR. HMS Falcon was a river launched in 1931 for the Yangtze River Patrol. During World War II, she had to withdraw to the Chinese wartime capital Chongqing, along with the retreating Chinese force to avoid being captured by the advancing Japanese invaders. In March 1941, the gunboat was paid off and her crew travelled overland to Yangon via the Burma Road and her guns were sent by elephants. The British decided to give the boat to Chinese as a gift, and Chinese in turn, began to train its own crew in preparation of the handover. HMS Falcon was officially handed over to Chinese in February 1942, and in the following month, Falcon officially joined the Republic of China Navy renamed as *Ying dé*. The gunboat served with ROCN until 30 November 1949, when the ROCN Riverine Flotilla commander defected to advancing communist force that blocked the Yangtze River, taking seven boats to the communist side. After joining the People's Liberation Army Navy, the gunboat was renamed, Nan Chiang, and served until 1974.

On the outbreak of the Second World War, Dauntless was recommissioned and joined the 9th Cruiser Squadron with the South Atlantic Command. In December, the squadron was transferred to the China Station, and in March 1940 *Dauntless* operated as a unit of the British Malaya Force while in the Indian Ocean. She operated mainly off Batavia, keeping watch on German merchant ships in the Dutch East Indies harbours. In February 1942 Dauntless returned to Britain, and underwent a refit at Portsmouth. Following this, she was transferred to the Eastern Fleet, docked in the Selborne dry dock at Simonstown, South Africa, until January 1943. She was then used as a training vessel from 1943 before being sold for breaking in 1946.
