Notes

This list of deaths and of memorials is compiled in order of date of death.

It has been compiled from the following sources:

- The list of military burials in Hong Kong collected by the year 1997 by the staff of Headquarters British Forces Hong Kong. This was donated to the Branch in July 2021 by Mr Stephen Verralls, President of the Hong Kong Branch of the Orders and Medals Research Society. It had originally been given to him by Mr Colin Aitchison, RA, late photographer of Joint Services Public Relations Staff, Hong Kong, who rescued it from being destroyed when the Garrison left. This list appears in places to be based upon independent research, in other places to be based upon a reading of gravestones. It is in some cases preferable to other sources, in others it is mistaken, and there are many typographical errors. It must be used with caution.

This text contains items that are doubtful (these are marked with a ?) or have been misrepresented or are wrong (these are shown in square brackets). Alternatives are shown with a / . Where sources differ, it is not possible at this stage, without further research in military records, to clarify which source is correct.

Military clerks from about 1940 onwards seem to have been less careful in typing names and dates than their forbears. They often seem to have entered the date on which a death was registered as the date of death. Where the gravestone is still clear, the date recorded there is preferred.

References to the location of graves in the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley, mean: Section/row/tomb number

Richard John Adams - Gunner, 80th Anti-Tank Regiment RA, Number 4970625, died aged 35, **30 August 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave V F 3.

Norman Charles Blogg - Sapper, RE, Number 2009990, attached HQ 18th Division Signals, son of Charles and Laura Blogg, husband of Doris Mabel Blogg, of Mile Cross,. Norwich, died aged 29, 30 August 1945, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave V F 3.

Sardar Khan - Lance Naik, Number 9811 5th Battalion 7th Rajput Regiment, died aged 18, **30 August 1945**. Son of Muhammad Hussain and Man; husband of Rasul Bibi of Chak Mehmad, Gujrat. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 28.

Reginald Allen - Trooper, Number 4133376, Royal Armoured Corps, died **1 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave V K 1. As there were no armoured units in the HK Garrison, it is likely that Trooper Allen was a POW who died while returning from Taiwan or Japan. **Karam Khan** - Sepoy, Number 10589, 5th Battalion 7th Rajput Regiment, died aged 33, **1 September 1945**. Son of Fateh Muhammad and Bundoo; husband of Mirzo Begum of Panthal, Palandri, Poonch, Kashmir. Commemorated on Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 29.

John William Lines - Gunner, Number 889985, 5th Field Regiment
RA, son of Albert Edward and May Winifred Lines, died aged 23, 2
September 1945, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VI E 8.

George Bennett Marshall - Able Seaman, RN, Number C/JX 655123, HMS *Swiftsure*, son of Hogg William and Agnes Smith Marshall of Glasgow, died aged 19, **3 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 7.

For HMS Swiftsure, see Samuel Hopkins.

Edward Wilde - Private, Number 5774454, 6th Battalion Royal Norfolk Regiment, son of Edward and Rose Wilde, husband o Doris May Wilde of Norwich, died age 27, **3 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VI D 1.

6th Battalion Royal Norfolk Regiment was part of the British forces that surrendered in Singpapore in 1942.

William Edward Forsey - Private, Hong Kong Dockyard Defence Corps, died aged 42, **3 September 1945**. Son of William Cornelius and Alice Priscilla Louisa Forsey; husband of Mabel Daisy Forsey of Buckland, Portsmouth. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 35.

Frank Holmes - Gunner, Number 944938, 125th Anti-Tank Regiment, RA, son of George Edward and Amelia Holmes, husband of Mary Monica Holmes of Heaton Moor, Stockport, died aged 27, **4 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VII E 17.

125th Anti-Tank Regiment RA was part of the Singapore Garrison during the Japanese invasion of Malaya, and its members became POWs. Gunner Holmes probably died on his way home from Taiwan or Japan.

Alfred Richard Kerr - Private, Number 6019461, 1st Battalion Cambridgeshire Regiment, the Suffolk Regiment, son of Robert Henry and Daisy Kerr, husband of Barbara Kerr of Chingford Essex, died as a result of a food drop, aged 27, **4 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave V K 3.

1st Battalion Cambridgeshire Regiment was in Singapore during the Japanese invasion.

Samuel Hopkins - Able Seaman, RN, Number C/JX 407266, HMS *Swiftsure*, died **5 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 9. HMS *Swiftsure* was one of three Minotaur-class light cruisers. She was launched on 4 February 1943, the first British cruiser designed around the concept of an operations room and modern radar, with sensor screens and communications positioned for efficient operation. On 30 August 1945, she was part of the fleet that re-entered Hong Kong and took the Japanese surrender there. *Swiftsure* was at this time the flagship of the British Pacific Cruiser Squadron, and was selected by Admiral Cecil Harcourt to hoist his flag for the Japanese surrender. During her service in the Pacific in 1945, she proved the most efficient anti-aircraft cruiser in the fleet.

Sylvester Moran - Signalman, Number 6906772, Royal Corps of
Signals, 29 Construction Section, son of John and Emma Moran,
husband of Hannah Moran, of Halifax, died aged 46, 5 September
1945, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VII D 12.

David Simpson Scott - Able Seaman, RN, Number C/JX 657933, HMS *Swiftsure*, son of Gilbert and Isabella Scott of Hawick, died aged 19, **6 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 8.

For HMS Swiftsure, see Samuel Hopkins.

Sardar Khan - Havildar, Number 11187, 2nd Battalion 14th Punjab Regiment, died aged 32, 7 **September 1945**. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 31. **Charles Fairbridge Allan** - Sergeant, Number 916815, RA, died **8 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave V A 3.

Gerald Golledge - Staff Sergeant, Number 1415975, 1st Hong Kong Regiment, Hong Kong and Singapore Royal Artillery, died aged 40, **8 September 1945**. Son of George and Amy Golledge; husband of Hilda Golledge of Toowoomba, Queensland. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 2.

Albert Arthur James - Sergeant, Number NX60056, A.I.F. 2/19 Battalion Australian Infantry, son of Albert and Elsie Marguerite James, husband of Minora May James, of Kogarah, New South Wales, died aged 33, **10 September 1945**. Buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VI A 2.

Harry Rogerson - Warrant Officer 2, Number VX35009, AIF 2/29 Battalion Australian Infantry, son of James Brown and Margaret America Rogerson, husband of Hilda Mary Rogerson of Oldham, Lancashir, died aged 44, **10 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VI A 4.

Richard Thomas Noble - Sergeant, Number NX35741, AIF 2/30 Battalion Australian Infantry, son of Richard Thomas and Elizabeth Noble, husband of Evelyn May Noble of Temora, New South Wales, died aged 37, **10 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VI A 3. Jack Livingston Gilding - Corporal, Number SX10013, died 10 September 1945. Buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VI A 6.

James Clapperton - Private, Number 3055328, 2nd Battalion
Royal Scots (the Royal Regiment), died aged 27, 10 September
1945. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference:
Column 11.

Ronald Simmons Cooper - Gunner, Number VX58497, son of Andrew Dresser and Madge Ellen Cooper of Gardenvale, Victoria, died aged 25, **10 September 1945**. Buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VI A 5.

Sydney Francis Bates - Gunner, Number 1712468, 8 Coast Regiment, Royal Artillery, died aged 35, **10 September 1945**. Son of Sidney and Bessie Bates of St. John's Wood, London. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 3.

John Burke - Lance Corporal, Number 6203596, 1st Battalion Middlesex Regiment, died aged 26, **10 September 1945**. Son of Michael and Agnes Burke of Cork, Irish Republic. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 14.

John Clarke - Gunner, Number 4914894, 7 Battery, 5th Heavy Anti-Aircraft Regiment, Royal Artillery, died aged 26, 10 September
1945. Son of Arthur and Annie Clarke of Ryecroft, Staffordshire.
Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column

4.

William Doxford - Corporal, Number 3736, Hong Kong Volunteer
Defence Corps, died aged 35, 10 September 1945. Son of William
and Elizabeth Doxford of Whitburn, County Durham.
Commemorated on Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 33.

Sidney Frederick Gilham- Sergeant, Number 6200749, 1st Battalion Middlesex Regiment, died aged 31, **10 September 1945**. Son of John J. R. and Rose M. Gilham of Notting Hill, London, England. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 13.

Desmond Mortimer Harrington - Signalman, Number 2323399, Hong Kong Signal Company, Royal Corps of Signals, died aged 26, **10 September 1945**. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 10.

William Richard James - Sergeant, Number 847074, 8th Coast
Regiment, Royal Artillery, died aged 25, 10 September 1945. Son of
George Evan and Ethel May James of Hakin, Pembrokeshire.
Commemorated on Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 2.

Thomas Patrick Malone King - Private, Number 6213522, 1st Battalion Middlesex Regiment, died aged 27, **10 September 1945**. Son of Patrick and Phyllis King of Acton, Middlesex. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 15. **Ernest Arthur Pargeter** - Private, Number 6203984, 1st Battalion Middlesex Regiment, died aged 26, **10 September 1945**. Son of Alfred and Kate Pargeter. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 16.

Charles Henry Price - Lance Corporal, Number 2324244, Hong
Kong Signal Company, Royal Corps of Signals, died aged 28, 10
September 1945. Son of Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Price of Allerton,
Liverpool, Lancashire. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial,
Grave Reference: Column 9.

Jack Lewis - Able Seaman, RN, Number P/JX 630174, HMS *Vindex*, son of Leslie Cranch and Alma Alexandra Lewis of Fratton, Portsmouth, died aged 19, **14/15 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 10.

HMS *Vindex* was a Nairana-class escort carrier launched in 1943, intended as a merchant ship but as an escort carrier. She was sent out to the Far East as the flagship for Rear Admiral Angus Cunninghame Graham. She was used to repatriate prisoners of war from Hong Kong back to Australia and Britain. On her return to Britain, she was placed in reserve and bought by her original owners the Port Line company.

Carlton Austin - Able Seaman, RN, Number C/JX 351908, HMS *Apollo*, son of Arthur and Alice Dorothy Austin of Linthwaite,

Yorkshire, died aged 22, **17 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I. B. 7.

HMS *Apollo* was an Abdiel-class minelayer launched in 1943. She took part in the Normandy Landings before being transferred to the British Pacific Fleet. She arrived at Melbourne on 1 August 1945, and was employed in repatriation work carrying former British prisoners of war to Shanghai for passage back to the UK. She also carried mail and stores to ships and establishments in the Pacific, including the British Fleet Base at Manus, Shanghai, various Japanese ports and Hong Kong. In mid-1946 *Apollo* returned to Chatham and was paid off into Reserve. She was broken up in 1962.

James William James - Squadron [Company] Quartermaster Sergeant, Number 2320831, Royal Corps of Signals, son of William and Emily James of Dublin, died aged 34, **21 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I H 2.

Frederick George Paine - Stoker 1st Class, RN, Number D/KX. 155772, HMS *Plym*, died **21 September 1945**. Son of Bertie Thomas and Lottie May Paine of New Romney, Kent. Commemorated on the Sai Wan (China) Memorial.

HMS *Plym* was a River-class frigate launched in 1943. With HMS *Bann*, HMS *Teviot* and HMS *Trent*, she provided anti-submarine escort to the convoy WS-33 which arrived in South Africa from the United Kingdom on 9 October 1943 with critical reinforcements for

service in Burma. The ship was destroyed in the United Kingdom's first nuclear weapon test, Operation Hurricane in 1952.

Vivian Benjamin - Private, Number 4989, Hong Kong Volunteer Defence Corps, died aged 52, **21 September 1945**. Son of Silas and Rachel Benjamin of Wembley Park, Middlesex. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 34.

Sheikh Munir - Sepoy, Number 976, 1st Battalion Hyderabad
Infantry, Indian States Forces, son of Sheikh Bannu and Jaitun Bi, of
Deulghat, Chikhli, Buldana, India, died aged 24, 22 September
1945. Buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave XI B 2.

1st Battalion Hyderabad Infantry were stationed in Singapore at the time of the Japanese invasion. Sepoy Munir was probably a POW who died on his way home from Taiwan or Japan.

Leslie George Shellam - Major, temporary Lieutenant Colonel, MBE, Number EC/2320, 11th Sikh Regiment, born 1913 in China, son of William Arthur and Florence Elizabeth Shellam; husband of Patricia Shellam, of Rathmines, Dublin, Irish Republic, died aged 32, **28 September 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave IV J 1. In March 1945 when serving as Lieutenant Colonel in the 11th Sikh Regiment, Shellam was recommended for an MBE 'for outstanding service and devotion to duty behind the enemy lines, and for initiative and leadership in difficult and trying conditions.' He had been responsible for training Chinese troops in Eastern China and had become cut off from the base behind Japanese lines. He and his party became dependent on intermittent supplies that could be dropped to him by plane. While being evacuated by plane, he and his party had to abandon the plane and jump with parachutes. On landing, Shellam spent several days re-collecting them and organized their safe return. The commendation concluded that he had 'made a material contribution to the maintenance of British prestige in this country.'

5th Battalion 11th Sikh Regiment was in Singapore from 1939 until the Japanese invasion.

James Cornwall McMullan - Lieutenant-Colonel, MID, Number 211792, General List, son of James and Lillie McMullan, husband of Rose Fenwick McMullan, of Ganges, British Colombia, died aged 41, 28 September 1945, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave III J 11.

William Crapper - Leading Stoker, RN, Number C/KX 91519, HMS *Flamborough Head*, son of Arthur and Fanny Crapper, husband of Amy Crapper of Crosspool, Sheffield, died aged 26, **1 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 13.

HMS *Flamborough Head* was a maintenance ship launched in 1944 and transferred to the RCN in 1952 as HMCS Cape Breton.

James William Adams - Private, Number VX 39777, died 1 October 1945, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave VI A 10. **Mervyn Edward Dibley** - Bombardier, Number 904863, 118th Field Regiment RA, son of George Edward and Stella Winifred Agnes Dibley of Bexley Heath, died aged 25, **2 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I H 3.

118th Field Regiment RA joined the Singapore Garrison in January 1942 just before the surrender. Bombardier Dibley was probably a POW who died while returning from Taiwan or Japan.

Francis Cyril Little - Able Seaman, RANR, Number H2051, HMAS *Yunnan*, son of Amos Henry and Daisy Theodora Little of Dromedary, Tasmania, died aged 21, **3 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I E 4.

Karam Singh - Cook, Number L/141, 4 Medium Battery, Hong Kong and Singapore Royal Artillery, died aged 24, **3 October 1945**. Son of Bhulla Singh; husband of Amro of Nurpur, Sarhalqasian, Jullundur. Commemorated on Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 22.

Geoffrey Barrett - Able Seaman, RN, Number C/JX 374519, HMS *Vengeance*, son of Alfred and Annie Barrett of Selby, died 7 October
1945, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 14.

HMS *Vengeance* was a Colossus-class light aircraft carrier launched in 1944. The carrier served in three navies during her career: the Royal Navy, the Royal Australian Navy (as HMAS *Vengeance*, from 1952 to 1955), and the Brazilian Navy (as *NAeL Minas Gerais*, from 1956 to 2001). In 1945, she was assigned to the 11th Aircraft Carrier Squadron of the British Pacific Fleet and sailed to Sydney via Alexandria, Port Said, Trincomalee, and Fremantle, arriving on 26 July. *Vengeance* was assigned to Task Group 111.2 of the British Pacific Fleet, and was to be deployed as part of the force attacking Japanese-held Truk, but did not leave Sydney until the war ended. Following the end of the war Vengeance was ordered to Hong Kong, and on 3 September was used as the venue for the Japanese surrender of the territory. She remained in the area until the end of 1945.

John George Little - Gunner, Number 996176, 148th (Bedfordshire Yeomanry) Field Regiment RA, died aged 32, **7 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I H 4.

148 Field Regiment was in Singapore at its fall in 1942.

James Desmond - Chief Engineer, RN, died 9 October 1945, Australian Merchant Navy, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I E 10.

Franklyn Cheers - Sub Lieutenant (A), RNVR, HMS *Vengeance,* son of Frank Lea and Margaret Elizabeth Cheers of Heswall, Cheshire, died aged 23, **15 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 15. For HMS Vengeance, see Geoffrey Barrett.

Muhammad Shafi - Sepoy, Number 179376, Hong Kong Mule
Comopany, Royal Indian Army Service Corps, died aged 30, 24
October 1945. Son of Nur Alam; husband of Lalan Bi of Moradakhil
Kalipari, Chauntra, Campbellpore. Commemorated on Sai Wan
Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 32.

Thomas Wheeler - Able Seaman, RN, Number P/J 721411, HMS *Wave King*, son of William John and Maud May Wheeler of Alum Rock, Birmingham, died aged 19, **27 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 16.

HMS *Wave King* was an Algerine-class minesweeper launched in 1944. She was sent to the Far East in October 1945, returning to Britain in 1946, when she joined the Fishery Protection Squadron. She was scrapped in 1962.

Gerald Henry Spinks - Signalman, Number 14412158, Royal Corps of Signals, died aged 21, **29 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 17.

John Owen Davies - Sergeant, Number 2580376, Royal Corps of Signals, son of Richard and Margaret Alice Davies of Norwood, died aged 24, **29 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 18. **Henry Carpenter Butt** - Lance Corporal, Number 14598239, Royal Corps of Signals, son of Henry and Edith Ethel Butt of Middlesborough, died aged 21, **29 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 19.

Leonard Riley - Signalman, Number 14322847, Royal Corps of Signals, died aged 21, **31 October 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II G 20.

Reginald [Richard] Charles Thompson - Aircraftman 2nd Class, Number 1238233, RAF (VR), son of Reginald Charles and Daisy of Norwich, died aged 22, **3 November 1945**, buried in Section 16D/4/8, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. Thomas H. Jenkins - Able Seaman, Australian Merchant Navy, husband of Mabel Heather Jenkins of Homebush, New South wales, died aged 35, **13 November 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I D 11.

Haydn Selby Rawson - Warrant Officer, Number 300549, Royal Australian Air Force Reserve, son of Ernest Henry and Violet Elaine Rawson, husband of Constance Viva Rawson of Cardwell, Nottingham, died aged 26, **13 November 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I D 9 [2]. **Lloyd George Jones** - Warrant Officer, Number 425645, Royal Australian Air Force, son of Arnold William and Edith Emily Jones of Tully, Queensland, died aged 26, **13 November 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I D 8.

Christopher R. Marshall Good - Warrant Officer, Number 417476, Royal Australian Air Force, son of William Duncan and Magdalen Good of Brighton, South Australia, died aged 21, 13
November 1945, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I D 10.

Walter King - Able Seaman, Australian Merchant Navy, SS *Elisha Witney*, son of Walter and Fanny Louisa King, husband of Dorothy Amelia King of Enfield, New South Wales, died aged 49, 14
November 1945, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I D 7.

Firoz Khan - Sepoy, Number 16160, 5th Battalion 7th Rajput Regiment, died aged 18, **15 November 1945**. Son of Ladha Khan of Loharian, Daulatnagar, Gujrat. Commemorated on the Sai Wan memorial, Grave Reference: Column 29.

Mehman Singh - Gunner, Number 3904, 1 Mountain Battery, Hong Kong and Singapore Royal Artillery, died aged 18, 15 November
1945. Son of Kirpa Singh and Kishan Kaur; husband of Gulab Kaur of Gopalau, Kalaur, Patiala. Commemorated on Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 19.

Muhammad Husain - Sepoy, Number 175729, Royal Indian Army Service Corps, died aged 26, **15 November 1945**. Son of Sultan; husband of Rahmat of Chanigondal, Sialkot. Commemorated on Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 32.

James Boyd Kennedy - Ordinary Seaman, RN, Number LT/JX 409741, RN Patrol Service, HMS B.Y.M.S. 2018, son of Jeannie Kennedy of Maybole, Ayrshire, died aged 20, **30 December 1945**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II F 8. HMS B.Y.M.S. was a motorized minesweeper launched in 1942 in the USA, transferred to Great Britain 16 July 1942, reclassified HMS J-818 and HMS BYMS-2018, and returned to the USA in 1946.

HMS Bermuda was a Fiji-class light cruiser launched on 11 September 1941. Through 1942, she participated in the North Africa campaign, then returned to service in the Atlantic to escort ships in the Bay of Biscay. In June 1943, she transported men and supplies to Spitsbergen. She then participated in anti-submarine operations against German U-boats operating in the Bay of Biscay, and the North Atlantic. She was then dispatched to the Pacific as the war in Europe was ending, in May 1945. She was part of an operation to recover allied POWs from the previously occupied Japanese territories. On 6 September Bermuda was attacked by Japanese aircraft, apparently unaware of the end of the war, or otherwise unwilling to surrender. She fought off the attack and was able to continue on her way. She then transported allied prisoners of war to Shanghai for repatriation. *Bermuda* remained in the Far East as the flagship of the 5th Cruiser Squadron, until 1947, when she returned to the UK. She was scrapped in 1965.

Frank Birse Sime - Lieutenant, RNVR, HMS *President* [*Tamar*], died aged 42, **18 January 1946**, buried in Section 21A/5/3, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. Robert James Carrington - Petty Officer, RN, Motor Mechanic, Number P/MX 125539, HMS *Tamar*, died **30 January 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II F 17.

Walter John Charles Tilbury - Warrant Officer (Wireless Operator/Air), RAF (VR), Number 1270900, 209 Squadron RAF, son of Charles Robert and Mary Tilbury, husband of Irene Murial Tilbury of Harmondsworth, Middlesex, died aged 26, **2 February 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 8.

209 Squadron flew Catalinas from 1941, moving to Iceland then East Africa. It flew patrols over the Indian Ocean with detached bases in South Africa, Madagascar, Oman and the Seychelles to extend its cover. In July 1945 the squadron moved to Ceylon, with recently acquired Short Sunderland MkVs, with a detachment at Rangoon, to harass Japanese shipping along the coast from Burma to Malaya. After the Japanese surrender, a detachment was sent to Hong Kong in September, followed by the rest of the squadron in October. In April 1946 the squadron moved to Singapore. A detachment remained at RAF Kai Tak and became No.1430 Flight and then No.88 Squadron. The squadron headquarters was established at RAF Seletar on Singapore Island on 18 May 1946 and No.209 and was named "City of Hong Kong" Squadron on 23 January 1947.

David Manson - Marine, Number 16377, Royal Marine Engineers,

A Royal Marine Engineers unit was part of 3 Commando Brigade that garrisoned HK from 1945 to 1947.

Cyril Stewart - Oiler, Australian Merchant Navy, Number TC13316, son of James and Annie Stewart, husband of Annie Stewart, of Matraville, New South Wales, died aged 47, **7 February 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I E 12.

Norman Mitchell - Able Seaman, RN, Number D/JX 563731, HMS *Widemouth Bay*, died **22 February 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II F 9. HMS *Widemouth Bay* was a Bay-class anti-aircraft frigate launched in 1944. She arrived at the Forward Base of the British Pacific Fleet at Manus, Admiralty Islands, in August 1945, just after the Japanese surrender. She remained on the Far East Station, based at Hong Kong, for the next year and a half, supporting post-war repatriation operations, carrying out patrols and escort duties. She was broken up in 1957.

S. J. Desai - Leading Aircraftman, Royal Indian Air Force, Number IND/25908, son of J. F. Desai and Shirin Bai of Bombay, died 24
February [March] 1946, buried in the Parsee Cemetery, Happy Valley, Grave 115. It is unknown why LAC Desai was in HK.

William James Augustus Phillips - Private, Number 14639543,
Sussex Regiment and No 5 Commando Royal Marines, son of William
Jackson and Amelia Phillips of Rush Green, Romford, died aged 23, 2
March 1946, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 9.

Keith Nelson Howard - Second Officer, RFA *Empire Salvage*, died **8 March 1946**, buried in Cape Collinson Cemetery, Grave 1 F 15. A picture of his gravestone is at:

RFA *Empire Salvage* was launched as the *Papendrecht* for commercial owners in 1940, and was unable to escape from her builder's yard when the Germans invaded Holland owing to the magnetic mining of the New Waterway. After seizure by the Germans, who altered her decks and fittings considerably for replenishment at sea duties, she sailed as a supply tanker. Her capture in 1941 by the British provide a valuable insight into the German methods of replenishment at sea, as having no bases, they had been forced to experiment and had evolved the buoyant rubber hose. She was renamed the *Empire Salvage* in 1941. By August 1945, she was part of the Pacific Fleet and operated in 1945-1946 in HK waters and as far as Japan. She was broken up in 1964.

Norah Kathleen Westaway - Matron, ARRC, Queen Alexandra's
Royal Naval Nursing Service, daughter of Engineer Rear Admiral
Albert Ernest and Sarah Ann Westaway, died aged 51, 14 March
1946, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 15.

In 1884, a uniformed Naval Nursing Service was introduced, staffed by trained nurses. These nurses served on shore, initially at Haslar and Plymouth. In 1902, Queen Alexandra of Denmark, the queen consort of Edward VII, became President of the Nursing Staff; in her honour, the Naval Nursing service was renamed Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service.

Alam Khan - Havildar, Number 42261, 5th (Mahratta) Anti-Tank Regiment, Royal Indian Artillery, son of Mukhtiar Khan of Tharar, Poonch, Kashmir, died aged 26, **15 March 1946**, buried in Kowloon Number 3 Muslim Cemetery, Ho Man Tin, Grave Sp. Mem "E", Number 14. 5th (Mahratta) Anti-Tank Regiment was converted to artillery from from 9th Battalion 5th Mahratta Light Infantry in 1942. It served in India and Burma in 1943-1944, commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel J.F.G. Gurney, then Lieutenant Colonel G.R. Dunbar from November 1944.

George Aitken - Leading Aircraftman, RAF (VR), Number 1373023,
110 Squadron RAF, son of Anthony and Mary Aitken of Calton,
Glasgow, husband of Rebecca Aitken of Glasgow, died aged 34, 18
March 1946, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 10.

110 Squadron RAF was a bomber squadron stationed in India in March 1942. From that year it operated Vultee Vengeance aircraft. In November 1944 it was re-equipped with the de Havilland Mosquito FB.VI. The squadron operated against Japanese targets in Burma. At the end of the war the squadron moved to Singapore, and remained active in the Far East until April 1946. It disbanded at Labuan on 15 April 1946.

Kenneth Robert George - Marine, Number PO/X 121699, 45
Royal Marine Commando, son of Robert and Sarah Annie George, husband of Jean Clarke George of Perth, died aged 20, 22 March 1946, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 7.

Joseph Hughes - Driver, GC, Number T/14858103, 387 Company, RASC, died aged 20 [19], **23 March 1946**, buried in Section 16D/2/1, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. Driver Hughes attempted to extinguish a fire in his lorry and warned those around, which was carrying old ammunition and explosives cleared in Lyemun Barracks, but was killed in the three chain explosions that followed. He was awarded a posthumous George Cross. He is commemorated by a plaque, originally in Lyemun Barracks, but moved in 2018 to the Museum of Coastal Defence.

Joseph Hall - Flight Lieutenant, RAF (VR), Number 149270, BSc Hons Physics (Manchester) son of Alfred and Elizabeth Ann Hall of Seaton, Cumberland, died aged 24, **26 March 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Collective Grave I F 5 7.

Roderick Cumming - Flight Lieutenant, Wireless Operator, RAF (VR), Number 159961, 243 Squadron RAF, died **26 March 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 16.

243 Squadron was re-raised during World War II, operating initially as a fighter squadron in Malaya and Singapore during 1941–42. It was

briefly disbanded just prior to the fall of Singapore, and was reformed in mid-1942, again as a fighter squadron, and fought in the Tunisian and Italian campaigns in 1942–44, before being disbanded in October 1944. In 1945, after training on transport aircraft in Canada, the squadron moved to Australia where it operated Dakotas in support of the British Pacific Fleet. By the end of the war, the squadron was flying scheduled services and extended these to Hong Kong on its surrender. A large proportion of the squadron personnel was Australian and they were demobilised locally when the Squadron disbanded on 15 April 1946.

Guy Charles Gladice Warburton - Flight Lieutenant, RAF (VR), Number 160675, 243 Squadron RAF, died **26 March 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Collective Grave I F 5 7.

Cedric John William Selman [Seeman] - Telegraphist, RN, Number D/JX 730200, HMS *Tamar*, son of Clifford John and Elsie Violet Selman of St Andrews, Bristol, died, aged 19, **29 March 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II F 5.

HMS *Tamar* was a troopship launched in 1863. She first visited Hong Kong in 1878 with reliefs crews, returned in 1886 and finally arrived in Victoria City on 11 April 1897. She was stationed permanently in the Harbour from 1897 to 1941, when she was scuttled. HMS Tamar (Chinese: 添馬艦) was the name for the British Royal Navy's base in Hong Kong from 1897 to 1997.

George Brockley - Corporal, Number 7398638, Pioneer Corps, died aged 26, **6 April 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 12.

The Auxiliary Military Pioneer Corps was formed in 1939, and became the Pioneer Corps in 1940. It became the Royal Pioneer Corps in November 1946.

Derek - Able Seaman, RN, Number C/JX 406899, HM Landing Ship Tank 321, son of Mr & Mrs E. Hawkins of Packmores, Warwick, died aged 21, **6 April 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I E 5.

Tong Siu Bun - Private, Number 1500604, 1st Battalion the Gloucestershire Regiment, Number 15001604, son of Tong Ta On and Leung Sze of Tong Kar wan, Kwang Tung, China, husband of Cheung Lai Yeung of Kowloon, died aged 23, **11 April 1946**, buried in Kowloon Roman Catholic Cemetery (War Grave), 474A.

1st Battalion Gloucestershire Regiment was in India then returned to the UK in 1947 to amalgamate with the 2nd Battalion in Jamaica.
Private Tong joined the Battalion in Calcutta in 1943, then became a member of the Hong Kong Volunteer Company in 1944.

Husain [Hussain] Ishaq - Stoker 1st Class, Number 8472, Royal
Indian Navy, HMIS Cauvery, son of Muhammad Ishaq and Yusuf
Mukadam of Veshwe, Ratnagiri, India, died aged 19, 20 April 1946,
buried in the Hong Kong Muslim Cemetery, Section 13 4248.

HMIS *Cauvery* was a Black Swan-class sloop launched in 1943. In 1944, she was part of the force deployed to support amphibious landings of the British Indian Army and the British Army in Rangoon as a part of Operation Dragoon. Between July–October 1944, she joined Force 66 in anti-submarine operations in the Indian Ocean. In March 1945, she played a major role in the bombardment of Letpan in preparation of landings by the Indian 4th Brigade to cut off the retreat of Japanese Imperial Army as a part of Operation Turret. In April, she was part of the task force for supporting the amphibious landings on Indian 26th Division on Akyab peninsula as a part of Operation Dracula. In July 1945, HMIS Cauvery was deployed to Malacca Straits for minesweeping operations as a part of Operation Collie. She was prepared for an amphibious assault on the Malayan coast, before the postponement of Operation Zipper. At the end of the war, she was in Singapore for the Japanese surrender ceremony. After India's independence, she was renamed INS Kaveri and served as a part of the 12th Frigate Squadron. She was decommissioned in 1977 and subsequently scrapped.

Norman Bennett - Able Seaman, RN, Number P/JX 527580, HMS *Whitesand Bay*, son of William and Lilian May Bennett of

Birmingham, died aged 21, **13 April 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II F 6.

HMS *Whitesand Bay* was a Bay-class anti-aircraft frigate launched in 1944 and in commission from 1945 to 1954. She served in the Pacific, Mediterranean, West Indies and Far East Fleets, seeing active service in the Korean War. *Whitesand Bay* was commissioned under the command of Lieutenant-Commander B.C. Longbottom for service with the Pacific Escort Force. She sailed to Hong Kong, arriving in December 1945, initially deployed in the South China Sea for patrols and trade defence, including the escort of colliers from French Indochina to Hong Kong. In May 1946 she sailed to Auckland, New Zealand to refit, returning to Hong Kong in August to resume patrol and escort duties. She was scrapped in 1956.

Norman Eric Newton - Lieutenant (SP), RNVR, HMS *Golden Hind*, son of William George and Elsie Newton of Eastleigh, Hampshire, died aged 23, **25 April 1946**, buried in Section 21A/4/3, the Colonial Cemetery, Happy Valley. On 20 November 1944, HMS *Golden Hind* was commissioned as an Accounting Base and headquarters at the former American army camp at Hargrave Park, Liverpool, Sydney, New South Wales. After the Japanese surrender, the barracks became a transit camp for personnel from the fleet awaiting passage home. Vice Admiral J. W. Rivett-Carnac, CBE, DSC, Vice Admiral (Administration) British Pacific Fleet relocated there on 1 December 1945. The camp closed in 1946.

Doris Bowyer - Sister, Number 348732, Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service, died **1 May 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 14.

Alan McGillivray Tough - Squadron Leader, RAF (VR), Number 105321, son of John Galloway and Mary Tough, husband of Ellen Ivy Tough of Southport, Lancashire, died aged 36, **12 May 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 11.

Raymond Joseph King - Steward, RN, Number P/LX 572408, HMS *Hare*, died **15 May 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II F 3.

HMS *Hare* was an Algerine-Class Fleet Minesweeper launched on 20th June 1944. She took passage in October 1945 for duty based initially at Singapore with the 10th Flotilla. The ship was first deployed for mine clearance in areas near Singapore including ports in Indonesia. Later she was based at Hong Kong for this duty, She returned to UK in September 1946. She was placed on the Sales List in 1959 and sold to Nigeria, renamed *Nigeria*, serving as the Flagship of the Royal Nigerian Navy until 1962 when she returned to UK fro break up.

T. H. Griffiths - Private, Number 14824670, the Devonshire Regiment and No 5 Commando Royal Marines, son of David Hedley and Bessie Mary Griffiths of Upper Eastville, Bristol, died aged 20, 15
May 1946, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave II F 1.

Michael Cullen - Marine, Number CH/X 115442, 45 Royal Marine Commando, died **15 May 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I G 13.

Son of Budhi Singh and Anop Kanwar; husband of Biraj Kanwar of Hukampura, Badu, Jodhpur. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Cremation Memorial.

E. J. Watts - Marine, Number PLY/X 112206, Royal Marines, son of William Carder and Florence Watts of Wollacombe, Devon, died aged 21, **8 June 1946**, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave I F 9.

Bagh Singh - Havildar, Number 4167, Jodhpur Sardar Infantry, Indian States Forces, died aged 25, **11 June 1946**. Son of Mangal Singh and Hem Kanwar of Osian, Bikamkor, Jodhpur. Commemorated on the Sai Wan Cremation Memorial.

Chinnayya - Sepoy, Number N, MTS/821954, 97 Mechanical
Transport Company, Royal Indian Army Service Corps, died aged 23,
11 June 1946. Son of Narasiah and Mangamma of Masulipatam.
Commemorated on the Sai Wan Memorial, Grave Reference: Column 31.

Yaqub Khan - Packer, Number 16805, Indian Army Medical Corps, son of Dost Muhammad Khan of Dhumtore, Hazara, India, died aged 21, 22 June 1946, buried in Sai Wan War Cemetery, Grave XI A 17.

The Bengal Medical Service was formed in 1764, the Madras Medical Service in 1767 and the Bombay Medical Service in 1779. The three medical services were combined into the Indian Medical Services (IMS) in April 1886 under a Surgeon General to the Government of India. HMS *Venerable* was a Colossus-class aircraft carrier launched in 1942. She served for only the last few months of World War II. On commissioning, she immediately headed to the Far East to join the 11th Aircraft Carrier Squadron (*Colossus, Glory* and *Vengeance*) of the British Pacific Fleet. Each carrier had around 40 F4U Corsair fighters and Fairey Barracuda torpedo bombers on board. After the end of hostilities, HMS *Venerable* repatriated prisoners of war to Canada and Australia, before returning to the UK. In 1948 she was sold to the Netherlands and renamed HNLMS *Karel Doorman*, taking part in the military clash in 1962 in Western New Guinea. Subsequently, she was sold to Argentina and renamed ARA *Veinticinco de Mayo*, later taking part in the Falklands War.

In 1946, she was deployed to the Far East, joining the 8th Destroyer Flotilla. While on passage back to the UK from the Far East in December 1947, *Cockade* and sister ship Contest were diverted to Aden in response to anti-Jewish rioting, with men from the two destroyers and the survey ship Challenger being landed to try to restore order. She was broken up in 1964.

HMS *Sussex* was one of the London sub-class of the County-class heavy cruisers, launched on 22 February 1928. *Sussex* spent 1944 in the Pacific, and covered operations in the Netherlands East Indies following the cessation of hostilities. On 26 July 1945, her Task Force was attacked by two attack bombers acting as kamikaze suicide weapons. One made an imprint on the side of *Sussex*, from which it could be identified as a Mitsubishi Ki-51 "Sonia". On Wednesday, 5 September 1945 at 11:30 am, HMS *Sussex* entered Singapore Harbour carrying the Flag of the Rear-Admiral Cedric Holland. General Seishirō Itagaki, the commander of the garrison at Singapore was brought on board, where he signed the formal surrender of the army, thus completing Operation Tiderace, the Allied plan to recapture Singapore. She was broken up in 1950.

She was attacked by a Japanese kamikaze aircraft as a ceasefire was announced, and fired some of the last shots of World War II. HMS *Black Swan*, the name ship of the Black Swan-class sloops, was launched in 1938. At the end of hostilities in 1945, Black Swan followed the cruiser HMS *Belfast* into Shanghai, the first Royal Navy warships to liberate Japanese concentration camps containing British and Empire prisoners. On 21 April 1949 she took part in the Yangtze Incident (20 April to 31 July 1949) when she, with HMS *London*, went to aid of HMS *Amethyst*. *Black Swan* suffered 12 men wounded and severe damage to her superstructure in a fierce engagement with Chinese batteries and fell back. The failed relief effort cost 46 killed and 79 injured [HMS *Amethyst* 22 killed, 31 wounded, 1 cat wounded *HMS Consort*: 10 killed, 23 wounded; HMS *London*: 15 killed, 13 wounded. HMS *Black Swan*: 12 wounded]. HMS *Black Swan* also served in the Korean War and was involved in the Battle of Chumonchin Chan. HMS Theseus was a Colossus-class light fleet aircraft carrier launched on 6 July 1944. She joined the British Pacific Fleet at Singapore as Flagship for the Flag Officer Air, Far East. In 1947, she deployed as the Flagship, 1st Aircraft Carrier Squadron with the British Pacific Fleet. On return to UK she refitted for service in Home Fleet. On completion, she joined the 3rd Aircraft Carrier Squadron, Home Fleet. In 1950, with the beginning of the Korean War, Theseus was deployed to Korea, commencing standard carrier operations. Her first operation involved suppressing enemy defences and communications at Chinnampo and other locations. Her second operational patrol involved only Combat Air Patrols (CAP), because her takeoff weight capacity was limited by a dysfunctional catapult, and thus the aircraft were unable to be armed with rockets and bombs. Her third operational duty was as part of a Commonwealth Task Force. Theseus sailed with accompanying ships from Sasebo in Japan. The carrier's aircraft launched successful air strikes on bridges, North Korean troops and other opportune targets. In 1956, Theseus was used as an emergency commando carrier, along with Ocean, during the Suez Crisis. She was broken up in 1962.

HMS *Kenya* was a Fiji-class cruiser launched in 1939. She joined the America and West Indies Station with the 8th Cruiser Squadron in October 1946, but in December 1947, she returned to the UK and was placed in the reserve. She was reactivated to replace the cruiser *London* on the Far East station, in 1949. *Kenya* took part in naval operations in the Korean War. In March 1950, she bombarded Choda Island in preparation for landing 200 Republic of Korea troops there. Unfortunately the troops never showed up. After further patrols off Inchon her next action came on 11 April when she was ordered to leave Sasebo to search for a communist aircraft that had been shot

down. She was called off the operation early to sail to Kure, Japan where Captain Podger took command of the ship on 22 April. In May she took position off Inchon and spent about 10 days there bombarding the land on several occasions. The patrols and bombardments continued throughout the summer – with a trip to Hong Kong that broke the monotony – until 25 August when she left Sasebo, via Hong Kong, for a refit at Singapore. She left the Far East Station on 17 November. She was scrapped in 1962.

Seven of those on board HMML 1323 died on 9 September 1953 when the launch was attacked by a Chinese vessel in what became known as the Pearl River Incident. The Far East Fleet had moved to Singapore in the late 1940s, leaving the HK Flotilla: 10 Seaward Defence Launches, 4 Motor Minesweepers, Inshore Minesweepers and 8 Landing Craft Assault, all based at HMS Tamar, or at the Small Ships Maintenance Based in Kowloon. When attacked by the Chinese gunboat, the Captain was severely injured, legs and limbs shattered, and died at his command post. Another shell instantly killed five crew members. This left one brave young man at the wheel, and Leading Seaman Cleaver BEM in command. At the wheel was Able Seaman Ralph Shearman. With the dead and dying five of his shipmates surrounding him, he carried on, steering the launch until another round killed him. The shellfire also left a severely injured seaman lying on the upper deck. Shearman received a posthumous commendation for bravery and a MID.

HMS Centaur was the first of the four Centaur-class light fleet carriers of the Royal Navy. She was launched on 22 April 1947. Centaur's first captain, appointed on 13 August 1953, was Captain H. P. Sears, RN, who was replaced in October 1954, by Captain H. C. F. Rolfe, RN. Centaur's initial air group of 25 aircraft consisted of nine Hawker Sea Hawk FGA6 of 806 Squadron, nine Hawker Sea Fury FB11 of 810 Squadron, six Grumman Avenger AS anti-submarine aircraft of 820 Squadron and one Westland Dragonfly HR5 of the ship's flight. She embarked British troops during the withdrawal from Trieste in October 1954 and escorted the royal yacht Britannia during a Royal Tour. In February 1955, the Sea Furys of 810 Squadron were disembarked, replaced by nine Sea Hawks of 803 Squadron. The Avenger AS4s of 820 Squadron were similarly replaced by six Avenger AS5s of 814 Squadron. She left for the Far East on 10 January 1956, in company with Albion. The Avengers of 814 Squadron were replaced by the re-formed 820 Squadron, with six

Fairey Gannet AS4s. She visited Hong Kong and Singapore, returning to Devonport on 15 May 1956. *Centaur* was withdrawn from service in August 1965 and sold for scrapping in 1972.

811 Squadron was reformed in the 1950s, with the Hawker Sea Fury, and embarked aboard HMS *Warrior* dispatched to the Far East for the Korean War. HMS Newfoundland was a Fiji-class light cruiser launched in 1941. On 5 November 1952, she became flagship of the 4th Cruiser Squadron in the East Indies. The cabinet of Sri Lanka met on board her during the hartal of 1953. She shelled Malayan National Liberation Army targets near Penang in June 1954. On 31 October 1956, the Egyptian frigate Domiat was cruising South of the Suez Canal in the Red Sea, when Newfoundland encountered her and ordered her to heave to. Aware of tensions between Britain and Egypt that would lead to the Suez Crisis, Domiat refused and opened fire on the cruiser, causing some damage and casualties. The cruiser, with the destroyer *Diana*, then returned fire and sank her opponent, rescuing 69 survivors from the wreckage. One man from the Newfoundland was killed and five were wounded.
